

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:


Baptisms are usually celebrated on the fourth Sunday of every month. Please contact the Parish Office at least 6 weeks before the date.

Intentions must be booked at least by the Wednesday, one week before the desired date.




Symbol of the circle : The circle represents the fulfillment of time being achieved in the coming of Advent Christ.

The Greenery : The Greenery suggests life, growth, and hope.

The candles and light: These remind us of the light Jesus brought into the world. The waiting for the four candles to be lit symbolizes the long years of waiting for a savior.

Colours of Purple and Pink : Purple is both a colour suggesting penance and fasting, perhaps, the coming of a Royal King. Pink is used as a colour of joy and expectation.

The four candles, three purple and one pink, symbolize the kind of preparation that we need to make for the coming of the child Jesus. The three purple remind us that we need to repent, for the kingdom of God is at hand, we need to re-orient our lives towards Jesus. The one pink candle is a reminder to us that through faith we can rejoice, for the coming of Christ will indeed happen.

Our Liberation is at Hand.

Every Advent, the Liturgy of the Word gives our sense of time a reorientation. There's a deliberate tension in the next four weeks' readings between promise and fulfillment, expectation and deliverance, between looking forward and looking back. In today's First Reading, the prophet Jeremiah focuses our gaze

on the promise God made to David, some 1,000 years before Christ. God says through the prophet that He will fulfill this promise by raising up a "virtuous Branch," a righteous offspring of David, who will rule Israel in justice. The Psalm, too, sounds the theme of Israel's ancient expectation: "Make me walk in iviere your truth and teach me: for you are God my saviour." We look back on Israel's desire and anticipation knowing that God has already made good on those promises by sending His only Son into the world. Jesus is the "virtuous Branch," the God and Saviour for whom Israel was waiting. Knowing that He is a ()

God who keeps His promises lends grave urgency to the words σ of Jesus in the Gospel.

La Urging us to keep watch for His return in glory, He draws on C Old Testament images of chaos and instability, turmoil in the heavens, roaring seas, distress among the nations and terrified Đ people. He evokes the prophet Daniel's image of the Son of Man coming on a cloud of glory to describe His return as a theophany, a manifestation of God.

ĝ Many will cower and be literally scared to death. But Jesus says we should greet the end-times with heads raised high, confident 1 that God keeps His promises, that our "liberation is near at hand," that the kingdom of God is near.



Advent: A Time of Preparation.

Advent is a period of preparation for the Church, extending over four Sundays before Christmas. The word Advent comes from the Latin advenio, meaning "to come to," and refers to the coming of Christ. This refers, first of all, to our celebration of Christ's birth at Christmas, and secondly, to the coming of Christ in our lives through grace and the Sacrament of Holy Communion, and finally, to His Second Coming at the end of time.

Our preparations, therefore, should have all three comings in mind. We need to prepare our souls to receive Christ worthily. That is why Advent has traditionally been known as "little Lent." The Church continues to stress the penitential and preparatory nature of Advent. As in Lent, Advent should be marked by increased prayer, fasting, and good works; priests wear purple vestments, and the Gloria is omitted during Mass. The only exception is on the Third Sunday of Advent, known as Gaudete Sunday, when priests can wear rose-colored vestments. As on Laetare Sunday during Lent, this is designed to encourage us to continue our prayer and fasting, because we can see that Advent is more than halfway over.

Perhaps the best-known of all Advent symbols is the Advent wreath, a custom which originated among German Lutherans but was soon adopted by Catholics. Consisting of four candles (three purple and one pink) arranged in a circle with evergreen boughs, and sometimes a fifth, white candle in the centre, the Advent wreath corresponds to the four Sundays of Advent. The purple candles represent the penitential nature of the season, while the pink candle is used on Gaudete Sunday. The white candle, when used, represents Christmas.
