

### **SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:**


Couples must contact the Parish Office to arrange at least 6 months before the desired date.

### **MASS INTENTIONS:**


Intentions must be booked at least by the Wednesday, one week before the desired date.

### October, the month of the Most Holy Rosary.

The month of October each year is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. As the Catholic liturgical year draws to a close, many of the feasts between mid-September and the First Sunday in Advent make reference to conflicts between Christianity and Islam, and great victories in battles in which the Church and, more broadly, Christendom, was threatened.

The memory of these events turns our thoughts to the end times, when the Church will undergo trials and tribulations before the return of Christ the King. It may not be obvious how dedicating the month of October to the Holy Rosary fits into this pattern. But the rosary and, more specifically, Our Lady of the Rosary, is credited with victory in a number of the battles that those feasts celebrate.

Chief among these is the Battle of Lepanto (October 7, 1571) in which a Christian fleet defeated a superior Ottoman Muslim fleet and stopped the westward expansion of Islam in the Mediterranean. In honor of the victory, Pope Pius V instituted the Feast of Our Lady of Victory, which is celebrated today as the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary every October 7th. In 1883, when Pope Leo XIII officially dedicated the month of October to the Holy Rosary, he made reference to the battle and the feast.

Legend tells us that the Rosary as a form of prayer was given to St. Dominic (1170 - 1221) by the Blessed Virgin Mary, who entrusted it to him as an aid in the conflicts with the Albigensians. Pope St. Pius V did much to further the spread of the Rosary and it thereafter became one of the most popular devotions in Christendom.

In 1569 Pope St. Pius V officially approved the Rosary in its present form with the Papal Bull "Consueverunt Romani Pontifeces". In 2002, Pope John Paul announced the addition of the Luminous Mysteries to the traditional mysteries of the Rosary.
