Family life in the Lord.

Underlying the wisdom offered in today's Liturgy is the mystery of the family in God's divine plan.

The Lord has set father in honour over his children, and mother in authority over her sons, we hear in the First Reading. As we sing in the Psalm, the blessings of the family flow from Zion, the heavenly mother of the royal people of God. And in the drama of the Gospel, we see the nucleus of the new people of God, the Holy Family, facing persecution from those who would seek to destroy the child and His Kingdom.

Moses, called to save God's first born son, the people of Israel, was also threatened at birth by a mad and jealous tyrant. And as Moses was saved by his mother and sister, in God's plan, Jesus too is rescued by His family. As once God took the family of Jacob down to Egypt to make them the great nation Israel, God leads the Holy Family to Egypt to prepare the coming of the new Israel of God - the Church.

At the beginning of the world, God established the family in the "marriage" of Adam and Eve, the two becoming one body. Now in the new creation, Christ is made "one body" with His bride, the Church, as the Epistle indicates. By this union we are made God's chosen ones, holy and beloved. And our families are to radiate the perfect love that binds us to Christ in the Church.

As we approach the altar on this feast, let us renew our commitment to our God-given duties as spouses, children and parents. Mindful of the promises of the First Reading, let us offer our quiet performance of these duties for the atonement of our sins.

The Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God - Jan 1st

Today we give thanks to Mary, the Mother of God. Her response to the angel, born of a humble heart, brought us life and salvation in the Child conceived in her womb.

From before all ages, God had destined her for this decisive role in salvation history. She was to be the woman who in the fullness of time would bear God's only Son. Thus, when we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary,

Mother of God we are not only honoring Mary, who was chosen among all women throughout history to bear God incarnate, but we are also honoring our Lord, who is fully God and fully human.

In times past, God spoke to His chosen people, the Israelites, through prophets, and imparted His blessings upon them through His priests. But now, He has sent His Son to reveal His glory and His kingdom and to make His way of salvation known to all nations. In the Infant lying in the manger, God has shone His face upon us.

Jesus is made a child of Israel, an heir of God's covenant with Abraham, by His circumcision. And we have been made adopted sons and daughters by Baptism, which is the circumcision of Christ, the true circumcision.

As children of God, we are heirs of the Father's blessings, which He promised to bestow on all peoples through the descendants of Abraham. This is the blessing which Aaron imparted to Israel, the people descended from Abraham. And this blessing comes to us through Mary and the Child. This is the good news of great joy that the shepherds make known in Bethlehem.

Like the shepherds, we too should make haste to find Jesus with Mary and Joseph, and to glorify God for His blessings.

And like Mary, we should keep His word and reflect upon it, letting it dwell richly in our hearts.
